## 10<sup>th</sup> Grade Summer Reading Assignment for *Thr3e* by Ted Dekker (Honors/CP)

### Part 1:

As you are reading, create a double-bubble map to compare and contrast the characters of Kevin (protagonist) and Slater (antagonist).

### Part 2:

1. Explain how the idea that good and evil coexist in the world is shown through the book.
2. Explain how this ties in with Scriptural truth about our souls vs. our flesh.

### Part 3 (Time for some fun):

Create a “soundtrack” for the book. Pick at least 5 significant events from the book and select songs which tie in with that section. (For example, they have a similar theme or emotion.) The songs do not necessarily have to have lyrics.

Tell me the title of the song and explain how that song specifically ties in with the portion of the book you have selected.

(These should be about 3-4 sentences EACH song/book connection.)

## Rubric for Summer Reading Assignment

### Part 1:

15 total points

### Part 2:

10 points-Must explain how good and evil are both in the world with examples from the text.

10 points-Must provide evidence from Scripture to back up the idea that mankind struggles with the split between God (our souls) and sin (our worldly desires)

### Part 3 (Time for some fun):

6 points for each song/30 points total

- 1 point for naming the song and artist

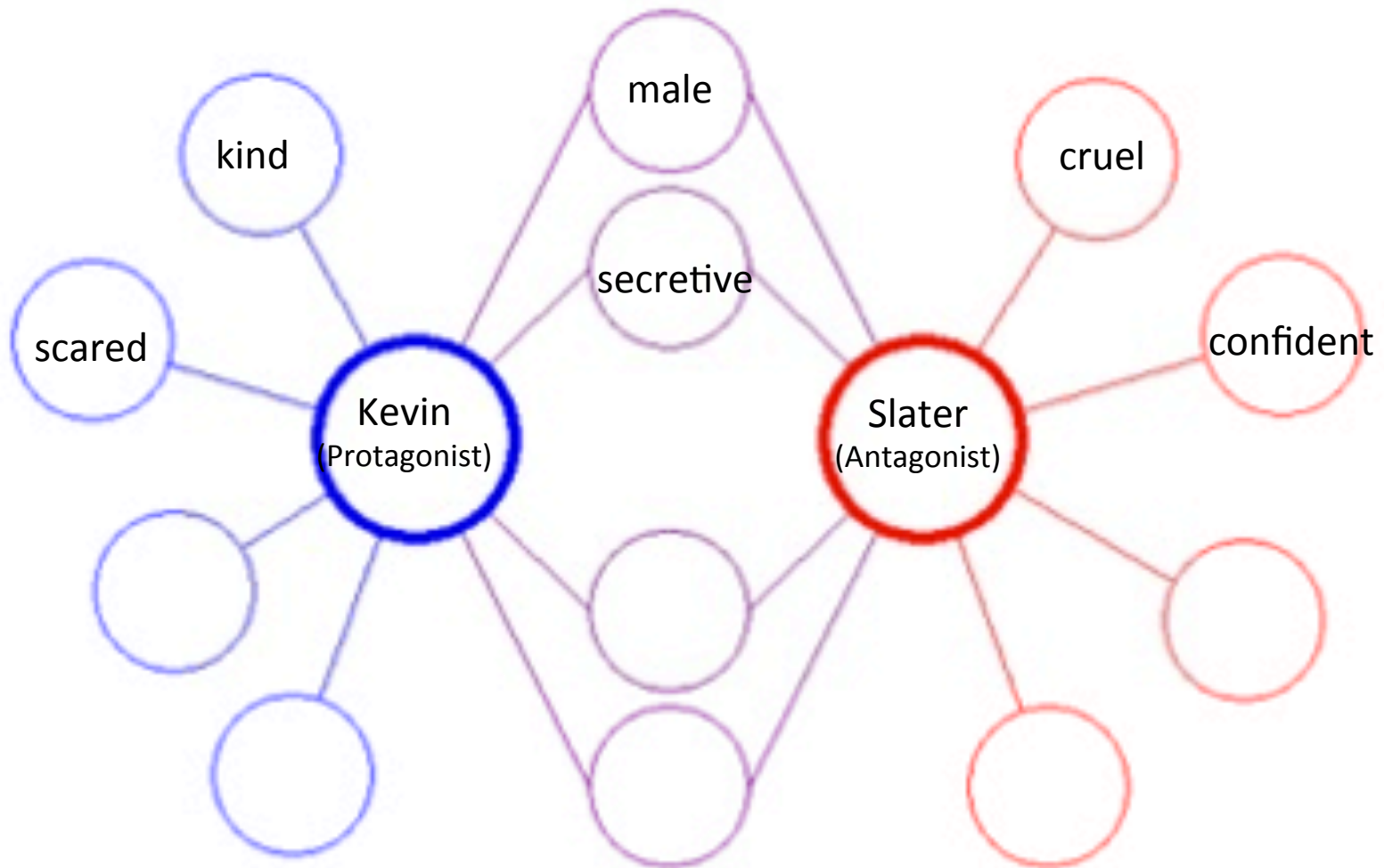
- 1 point for the SPECIFIC event/episode the song is tied to in the book

- 4 points for the explanation of how the song connects to that event/episode in the book.

# Example Double Bubble Map-10<sup>th</sup> Grade CP/Honors Summer Reading Assignment

Book: *Thr3e* by Ted Dekker



The bubbles are to be filled in with characteristics or traits of the characters. Bubbles on the edges are specific to that character only. Bubbles shared in the middle are shared between characters (true for both characters).
