Job Summary: The lead teacher will be a Christian that will support and inspire special needs students to gain the knowledge and skill set for behavioral, academic, and spiritual development, consistent with The First Academy philosophies, vision and mission statement. This is a 10 month, salaried, and benefited position for full time employees.

Credentials:

- Required to be a Christian as Living Curriculum
- Florida State Certified Teacher with a Bachelor's Degree, preferred ESE credentials
- Certification and experience in Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) preferred
- 1-2 years of experience working with special needs students
- CPR certification preferred

Essential Job Functions:

- Lead up to eight students (no more than 10) and up to 3 paraprofessionals (no more than 4)
- Creative, problem solving skills, multi-tasker, and team player in a special needs setting
- Daily data documentation to track progress in alignment with student goals
- Responsible for providing structured learning activities for paraprofessionals implement to help each child with their individual "mastered" and "current" goals
- Prepare appropriate weekly lesson plans including instructional objectives, planned activities, Biblical integration, assessments and resources, incorporating classroom technology to enhance instruction
- Plan, prepare and deliver lesson plans and instructional materials in a manner that facilitates active learning, effectively utilizing the basic elements of instruction; including but not limited to presentation of content, questioning techniques, responding to learner input and arrangement of learning activities
- Demonstrate the spiritual maturity, academic ability, and personal leadership qualities to inspire student learning, including the understanding of the knowledge and characteristics of the age group taught
- Effectively manage classroom and behavior procedures to provide a positive

classroom environment conducive to learning, including modeling effective teacher/parental partnering through timely communication with parents in support of student learning (e.g., posting of assignments, grades, conferencing)

- Actively participate in extracurricular activities in support of school initiatives

Behavioral Requirements:

- Help develop, update, and implement Behavior Intervention Plans, including paraprofessional training on implementation
- Knowledgeable and proficient in strong classroom structure, visual aides for students, and sensory activities
- Experience with assistive technology and resources is preferred

Required Qualifications and Experience:

- Evidence a mature personal Christian faith consistent with the First Academy Statement of Faith including being a born again Christian, active Church member, exhibiting a close personal walk with Jesus Christ: modeling an exemplary Biblical lifestyle and evidencing maturity in the understanding and integration of sound Biblical principles in classroom instruction and personal counseling
- Demonstrate an understanding of and a commitment to the distinctive qualities of Christian education
- Feels called by God to the special needs teaching profession
- Present a positive image of the school to others and to the community
- Recognize and assist parents to have primary responsibility before God for their children's education
- Ability to maintain an appropriate work/life balance
- Demonstrate strong problem solving and conflict resolution skills, incorporating the appropriate level of diplomacy and tact
- Possess solid communication skills, both written and verbal, strong organizational skills, ability to finish tasks in a timely manner and effectively partner and collaborate with others
- Ability to maintain confidentiality pertaining to school/student matters
- Experienced with using technology in a classroom environment, preferable Apple product
- Embrace being a lifelong learner and ongoing development of professional skill set
