COLLEGIATE LEARNING STYLE

Students participate in virtual class discussion boards, collaborative group projects, hands-on learning activities, and more to prepare them for high school and college.



SPIRITUAL LEADERSHIP

Each grade has student chaplains who help with chapel band, direct announcements, introduce chapel guest speakers, and may help lead Bible studies in lower grades.



STUDENT ADVISORY TIME

Middle schoolers can use this weekly check-in time to attend club meetings, get caught up on assignments, meet with teachers, and more.



9TH GRADE

Students meet with an advisor to discuss college prep and available electives, honors classes, Advanced Placement (AP) courses, and prepare for concurrent or dual enrollment.

10TH GRADE

1:1 college-prep meetings begin, and students participate in an SAT/ACT Boot Camp, take the PSAT, attend a Christian college fair, and colleges visit campus. 11TH GRADE

1:1 college advisory meetings continue, with parents invited to college-prep sessions and students taking ACT/SAT exams as well as visiting colleges.

12TH GRADE

Seniors participate in a college application summer camp, take the ACT and SAT in the fall, tour colleges, and finalize their capstone project — the Dr. Steve D. Whitaker Senior Thesis.

CAPSTONE PROJECT - THE DR. STEVE D. WHITAKER SENIOR THESIS

Students begin working on the Senior Thesis project in ninth grade and continue through senior year when they present their final research to a panel. The Senior Thesis Project focuses on how students see God at work in a secular world and is a way for them to develop skills that will help them in college and beyond.

Students are exposed to science, technology, engineering, and mathematics — STEM — through our Science and Innovation Center as well as STEM-related classroom activities.

ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

All children have a school-issued iPad starting in third grade, which is used for individual work, group projects, and assessments.

MIDDLE SCHOOL

Students explore the sciences through hands-on learning and experiments, such as making an edible cell. Starting in seventh grade, they are given a Macbook laptop.

HIGH SCHOOL

Students take a field trip to indoor skydiving center iFly and can participate in robotics, physics, science clubs, Environmental Committee, Beach Cleanup Club, Science Honors Society, and more.
