# UPPER SCHOOL

# 9

### 9TH GRADE

Students meet with an advisor to discuss college prep and available electives, honors classes, Advanced Placement (AP) courses, and prepare for concurrent or dual enrollment.

# 10

### 10TH GRADE

1:1 college-prep meetings begin, and students participate in an SAT/ACT Boot Camp, take the PSAT, attend a Christian college fair, and colleges visit campus.

# 11

### 11TH GRADE

1:1 college advisory meetings continue, with parents invited to college-prep sessions and students taking ACT/SAT exams as well as visiting colleges.

# 12

### 12TH GRADE

Seniors participate in a college application summer camp, take the ACT and SAT in the fall, tour colleges, and finalize their capstone project – the Dr. Steve D. Whitaker Senior Thesis.

## CAPSTONE PROJECT - THE DR. STEVE D. WHITAKER SENIOR THESIS

Students begin working on the Senior Thesis project in ninth grade and continue through senior year when they present their final research to a panel. The Senior Thesis Project focuses on how students see God at work in a secular world and is a way for them to develop skills that will help them in college and beyond.
